## Girls Snare CTL Lead

The Mulvane High School girls keep reaching one milestone after another this season, one of the best in recent memory. The Lady Cats left their tracks on another opponent Friday night, Feb. 9, at Augusta when they hustled off with a 51-43 victory over the Orioles to solidify their hold on first place in the Chisholm Trail League.

The victory hiked the MHS girls record to 7-2 in the loop and 11-5 overall, and also put another loss on the Augusta slate. The Orioles were one of the teams chasing the Cats.

"On the road and over there, this was another big one for us," admitted Gregg Wolgast. "They are one of the top teams in the standings, so it helps us out from that standpoint, too."

A technical foul on the Augusta coach was one of the most serious blows against Augusta. With Mulvane leading by three with less than three minutes left, the technical foul gave the Cats a big lift with three free throws made, two of them from the "T" and a bucket on the possession to boot.

"That was a big opening," admitted Wolgast. "We were in the driver's seat but that gave us a cushion and things opened up from there. After that, it was a matter of getting the good defense with a hand in the face on their three-point tries."

The Cats pulled away, out scoring Augusta, 21-8, in the final quarter. Juniors Kendra Banzet and Ticia Nicholson provided the firepower. Banzet poured in 18 points and Nicholson hit for 12. Sophomore guard Tricia Turner scored seven points; Kerri Taylor had her top game, six points, and Lisa Heersche added five points and had live assists.
