

Winning Formula Eluding Girls, Clearwater, Augusta Swamp Cats

The Wildcats got "stump-ed" Monday night, Feb. 15, at Clearwater and it hasn't been the first time for Coach Bill Brown's girls. Mulvane ran into a one-woman team as Carolyn Stump poured in 27 points to pace Clearwater's 53-29 victory over Mulvane.

"They just have too much experience in four seniors and too much Stump," said Brown. "I think Clearwater's playing as good as anybody in the area right now."

It was the second loss to the Indians this season and lowered the Cat record to 2-13. Earlier, the Wildcats held on before losing, 52-45, in the Mulvane Tournament.

"We didn't play very good basketball, though," said Brown. "We came out playing pretty good, then Stump got loose for a couple of baskets and we started backing off."

Brown also lamented the loss of his club's shooting eye. "We only hit 10 of 60 shots," said Brown. "You've got to do better than that. The key was getting only two points and no baskets from our guards. We have to have some scoring from our guards. When we don't get it, we're not in the game."

Junior Mary Cole led the Wildcat scoring with 14 points. She also had 11 rebounds. Sophomore Tawnya Infinger

had her best offensive game, scoring nine points and junior Nancy Gehring had four points.

The Wildcat junior varsity surprised Clearwater, handing the Indians a 43-37 setback, only the fourth loss for Clearwater's B-team. The Cats upped their record to 3-9.

Stacy Shoemaker turned in her biggest game of the season, scoring 15 points for the Wildcats and guard Diane Mohny added 10. Lisa Swayne and Jay Kilpatrick scored six and five points, respectively.

At Augusta Thursday, Feb. 11, a taller

Augusta squad throttled the Wildcat offensive inside to claim a 50-32 triumph over Mulvane.

Junior Mary Cole led the scorers for MHS as she scored 16 points but there wasn't much help behind her. Gehring and Jay Kilpatrick each scored four points and Celia Rogers scored three.

Augusta also shelled the Cat junior varsity, 38-24, dropping coach Leah Fairchild's club to 2-9 on the season.

Guard Lisa Swayne scored nine points and another guard, Diane Mohny had six for the Wildcats.
