Girls Can't Find Shooting Touch

Whoever said defense is 90% of a basketball game. Mulvane High School girls basketball coach Bill Stinson says it takes two to tango.

Scoring points continued to be a problem for Stinson's Wildcats Monday night, Feb. 21, at Andover, enabling the Trojans to spank the Cats, 46-36, in a non-league game.

Although the outcome sent the MHS girls skidding to 5-13 on the campaign, it didn't dishearten the Mulvane coach. "They've got one of the best teams in the state," said Stinson. "They're a good basketball team. Tops in the Chisholm Trail and we stayed right in there with them."

The Wildcat girls will close out their home schedule tonight (Feb. 24) by entertaining Goddard. They'll be in the Class 5A Sub-State Tournament which starts Thursday, March 5, in Arkansas City. Pairings won't be announced until Saturday, Feb. 26.

A fourth-period surge by the Cats, 14-7, helped make it close after the Trojans opened up a 17-point lead in the third quarter by out-scoring Mulvane, 21-5.

Sinson summed his club's woes up in one word. Shooting. "We're trying," said the first-year coach. "We just don't have the shooting that's needed. That's what it comes down to. Everybody (on the team) has to shoot better than they are. We hit 26% against Andover, which is our record this year, but that's not good enough. We can't shoot that and win ball games.

"Jay (Kilpatrick) has been coming around and Mary (Cole) is shooting okay but we still have to have better shooting out of everybody, including

Kilpatrick had one of her best games in her two years as a starter. She scored a career-high 16 points. Cole finished with 10, and guard Diane "Lefty" Mohney and Tawnya Infinger had four each.

"Jay kept us in there in the first half, then we came out, made a couple of mistakes and they made some buckets, then, we paniced," said Stinson. "We've got to realize we have to just battle back and not panic, but that comes from learning."

At Buhler Friday night, Feb. 18, the Cats tangled with another state-ranked team and came away with a 60-31 thrashing. It wasn't much of a game after the Crusaders bolted to a 37-13 advantage at intermission.
