In the junior varsity finale, Goddard outlasted the Wildcats, 19-15. Top scorer for Mulvane was Danielle Hughes with four points and Carrie Burkhart with three.

It was a mess. Put it behind you and forget about it. That's what Mulvane HIgh School girls basketball coach Ron McMahon wanted to do following a 56-33 shelling by Maize Friday night, Feb. 18, at Maize.

The loss knocked the Wildcats out of any hopes of moving up in the Chisholm Trail. Maize stands second in the league right behind undefeated leader Buhler with only one loss. The Cats fell to 7-4 for the season in the league.

"It was one of those games," said McMahon. "The second and third quarters, we had a lot of turnovers and that hurt us. They put the ball in the hole and we didn't. That's why they won. We need to put this one behind us. We didn't play as good as we could have or should have. Some days, you have good games and others you have bad games. This was one of the bad games."

After playing the Eagles tough in the first quarter, trailing only 9-7, Maize ripped out to a 23-13 lead by halftime, then made the lead more than 20 points in the third frame by out-scoring the Cats, 22-11.

"They had the size on us and they got the ball inside to their post people," said McMahon. "They just did a good job inside against us. We just didn't do the job we needed to do on their inside players. They also were getting position on us and at times, we were just out of position. Maize just played a better game than we did."

"I think the girls are allowed that game,

coming off two well-played games where we played well and played with character, poise and good team play," said McMahon. "In the second and third quarters, Maize just played a lot better than we did. We also lost both Banzet and Wenke to fouls later in the game and that certainly didn't help our cause."

Mulvane's scoring leader was Cody Watson with 13 points. Janelle Wenke had five points, Banzet finished with four and Shannon Reed scored three.

Maize also racked up the Cats in the junior varsity outing, 50-30, blowing the game open in the final half.

Jamie Martin had eight points and so did Valeric Larson for Mulvane's best offensive output. Marcy Arnold scored six points and Lee Cates had four points.
