MHS Girls Get Ready To Roll

So they don't shoot well and they're slow. But any way you look at it, Coach Kelly Dennis' Mulvane Wildcats girls are the team nobody wants to tangle with next week when sub-state play begins.

The Cats bottled up a hapless Chaparral girls team Friday night, Feb. 20, sweeping the season series with a 43-24 thumping of the Roadrunners.

The victory bumped Mulvane's record to 6-13 and 3-8 in the Chisholm Trail League Division II. Chappy stumbled to 0-9 in the league and 1-16 overall.

At this time of year, though, everything seems tilted toward the sub-state, which starts Monday, March 2. "We played pretty good basketball," said Dennis, "but we didn't play a very good team. The good thing about it is that everybody on the team scored. It's kind of hard to tell just how good you played against a 1-16 team but I thought we looked good. We got everybody in and they all helped out. It's a good tuneup for the sub-state."

Mulvane's defense was special, chalking up the lowest points allowed this year. The previous best: two months ago at Chappy when the Cats gave up only 25 points. "Our defense has really jelled," stressed Dennis. "We're trying to make people beat us with one shot from the perimeter and the girls are starting to believe in that theory. We've been mixing up our defense, playing both a man-to-man and a zone."

Rebounding and defense came to Mulvane's rescue in the second half against Chappy. After taking only a 20-13 lead into the locker room, Dennis' gals came out in a fury, out-scoring Chaparral, 14-5, in the third quarter and mopping up in the last period.

Nine Cats scored with senior Melissa Buchanan and Lindsay Kendrick paving the way with eight points each. Guard Michelle Fowler scored six points and Kristin Buchanan had five. Heather Williams, Shelley Richards and Kassie Hargrove scored four points each.

The girls will end their regular season tonight (Feb. 26) with an unusual Thursday night game at Circle. The game won't count toward sub-state pairings because the pairing was done after games played Tuesday, Feb. 24.

The Cat junior varsity girls were edged out by Chaparral, 22-21, Friday night. Shiriah Craft and Aubrey Benjamin led the scoring

with six and seven points, respectively.

The JV girls hosted Clearwater Tuesday, Feb. 17, and suffered another close loss, 32-22. In that game, Arin Leonard and Craft had four points each.

The junior varsity girls also played Saturday, Feb. 21, in the Goddard JV Tournament and came away with two losses. Goddard topped the Cats in overtime, 39-33, in the opening game and Andale closed out the Cat JVs in the third place game, 36-28.

Against Goddard, Piper Roy scored eight points, Kristal LaPlant had six and Natalie Turner had five. High scorers in the Andale game were Arin Leonard, Turner, Andrea Hufford, LaPlant, Benjamin and Roy with each with four points.
