"Still, we did improve our play and were in quite a few games. We were competitive and that's what we wanted to accomplish this year."

The Orioles didn't provide much competition past the first quarter. Ahead only 10-8 at the first-quarter mark, the Wildcats out-scored Augusta, 13-4, and 12-6, in the second and third frames to throw the game out of control.

"We started with a zone and went to a man-to-man and just physically outmatched them," said Stinson. "We won because we were a better team and it was just a matter of getting the girls to play our game."

All five starters scored in the second quarter, and sophomore Lori Cox scored eight points and junior Lisa Jones had six in the middle two periods when the game was decided.
