MHS Girls Into Sub-State Semis

The easiest way to get beat by an underdog is to let her hang around.

There was no "hanging around" for Douglass Tuesday night, Feb. 27, in the opening round of the Augusta Class 4A Sub-State. Instead, the Bulldogs were simply hanging on as the host Mulvane Wildcats girls charged out of the starting blocks on their way to an easy 55-33 triumph over Douglass.

The Wildcats came into the game as the tournament's No. 1 seed. Douglass was No. 8 and sporting a 1-19 record. "That was our No. 1 goal," observed MHS girls coach Jayson Miller. "We talked before the game about coming out early and trying to put Douglass out of it, get up on them. I didn't want to let them hang around, and we didn't. I thought we did a good job right from the start of getting the momentum

going our way and not letting up."

The victory improved Mulvane's record to 10-11 and pointed the Cats in the direction of the semifinal round, which will be

Friday, March 2, at Augusta High School. Mulvane will play the 7:30 p.m. game Friday night against the El Dorado girls (8-14). El Dorado marched into the next round by clipping Rose Hill, 42-25, in a first round game at Rose Hill.

Another reason for a solid start was that top scorer-rebounder LaShelle Parker was riding the bench the whole game with a back injury. "She could have gone in there if needed but we wanted to give her another two days or rest of get ready for Friday night," said Miller. "The other post people really picked it up. Kris (Lazar) really kicked it in and Shayna (Duncan), Nicole (Hackley) and Andrea (Valerio) all contributed to our game inside, so we didn't have to use Parker."

Mulvane answered the opening tip with a two-fisted flurry, jumping out nearly immediately to a 10-point edge with guard Melissa Doerfer and Lazar fuelling that fire. By intermission, the Wildcats were in the proverbial rocking chair, holding a 29-14 lead against a Bulldog team that had only one win to show for the season. That early surge, as Miller had hoped, kind of took the bite out of the Bulldogs.

"That early push really helped get things established for us," agreed Miller. "We went a little flat in the 3rd quarter and they made a little run at us but we got it right back up to 20 and held it there. I thought the game in the second half got a little sloppy on both sides of the ball. I think both teams tried to do some different things after it became apparent who was going to win the ball game."

Miller pointed to his early defense as being a difference-maker, too. "We really played defense well early," acknowledged the Wildcat coach. "We were quicker then they were and we got a lot of steals off our regular defensive sets. When they turned the ball over, we got more shots at the basket and when you get more chances to score, you're going to score more. That's pretty much what happened."

Mulvane's balance also "happened," too. Doerfer had a fine game, scoring 13 points. Lazar maintained her torrid pace, hitting 12 points and Sami Booth scored nine. Reserve Nicole Hackley had her biggest output of the season, scoring six points, and senior

Jackie Burkhart finished with six. Also getting into the scoring column were reserves Michelle Dinkel and Duncan (four each) and Valerio with one.

Now, it's on to Augusta and another shot at El Dorado, coached by former Mulvane girls coach Kelly Dennis. Remember last season? The El Dorado girls ended Mulvane's season in the sub-state semifinals by a 48-33 count.

"We're looking forward to another shot at El Dorado," said Miller. "They beat us in the semifinals last year and kept us from going so we want to take that back."


