Doom Cats In Finale

Almost every time down the floor, Goddard rolled, almost like a tidal wave. In its wake, Mulvane High School's girls basketballers found themselves being swallowed up Thursday night, Feb. 24, in a Chisholm Trail League game.

Goddard pounded the shores of Mulvane that night for a 68-33 victory, in the final game of the regular season for Coach Bill Stinson's Wildcats.

"We never did stop their fastbreak," said Stinson, shaking his head. "We played Goddard a real good ball game over there and I'm sure they came into this game wanting to take it to us."

The Lions did just that, getting a host of fastbreak lay-ups to build a 29-15 halftime lead. Goddard sealed the victory with a 25-9 edge in scoring in the fourth quarter.

The loss skidded Mulvane's record to 5-14 overall and 2-8 in the Chisholm Trail and sent the Cats into the Class 5A Sub-State Tournament at Ark City Friday night, March 5, on a low note. In their last three games, the Wildcats were beaten by 35 points, by 40 points and by 29.

Mulvane will play at Ark City at 6:30 p.m., meeting Coffeyville (5-14).

"They just put it to us," said Stinson about the Goddard charge. "We were having problems with their man-to-man and started getting frustrated with it. When you do that, you stop thinking, and that's what happened. We're still not the best team against pressure."

quarter," added Stinson. "We went to a man-to-man trying to make something happen. In our last three games, we've played Buhler, one of the best two or three teams in the state rankings, and Andover, another ranked team, and Goddard, so it's not like we've played really poorly. Still, I would have liked to gone into the tournament with a couple of wins."

Senior Mary Cole led the scoring for Mulvane with eight points against the Lions. Seniors Stacy Shoemaker, having one of her best scoring games, and Jay Kilpatrick scored six points apiece and Nancy Gehring added five.

The Wildcat junior varsity ended its season slumping, as Goddard rapped the Cats, 61-39. The MHS jayvees were 10-6.

Guard Lisa Jones scored 12 points for Mulvane. Darla Reekie added eight points and Lori Meek scored six.
