

# Andover Eliminates Girls

Mulvane girls basketball coach Bill Brown could have sworn there were two games going on Monday night, March 1, in the first round of the Class 4A Girls Sub-State Basketball Tournament at Andover.

He was watching one and the two officials were watching the other...or so it seemed. The Wildcats couldn't salvage a career-ending victory for Brown (see sidebar) as Andover advanced in sub-state play with a 49-34 decision.

"When an opponent shoots 34 times at the free throw line and you shoot only twice, something's wrong," complained Brown, who had announced to his team his intentions to leave his post as the MHS girl's cage coach two days earlier. "It's sad to see that kind of refereeing at the state level. We just wanted equal treatment for both teams. When you have 16 field goals for each team and

lose by 15 points, it makes you wonder. We didn't even get in a bonus situation."

The Wildcats were whistled for 26 fouls, Andover's Trojans for eight.

Overall, Brown praised his outfit's effort. "The kids did a super job last night," said Brown.

Offensively, juniors Mary Cole and Nancy Gehring again carried the load. Cole scored 10 points, as did Gehring. Sophomore Tawnya Infinger scored six points and Jay Kilpatrick had four.

The loss ended Mulvane's season at 2-17 for the second year in a row. In the

Chisholm Trail League, The Cats went 2-8, both victories coming against Wellington.

The Wildcat girls closed out their regular season to mixed reviews at Goddard Thursday, Feb. 25. The Cat varsity was shellacked, 55-36, by the Lion first-liners but the Mulvane junior varsity clipped Goddard, 28-23.

The Lions rolled out to a 32-22 halftime margin and the Cats never recovered. Mary Cole led the scoring with 19 points and sophomore Tawnya Infinger added nine.

The loss dropped Mulvane to 2-8 in the Chisholm Trail and 2-16 overall.

Coach Leah Fairchild's junior varsity ended the year on a high pitch, logging its third victory in the last four games. Overall, the Cat jayvees went 5-10.

Stacy Shoemaker, a junior, hit double figures with 10 points, Diane Mohney scored eight and Gwen Reekie had six.
