Nickerson Knocks Out Girls

NICKERSON—The season flashed before Coach Gregg Wolgast's eyes as he watched his Mulvane High School girls eliminated from sub-state play here Tuesday night, March 2.

Nickerson's No. I seeded Panthers took a quarter to get warmed up, then Mulvane crashed and burned in a 56-27 game in the first round of the Chaparral Class 4A Sub-State.

The Wildcats ended their season at 3-18 and Nickerson marched on to the semifinal round match-up at Chaparral High Friday night, March 5, against Pratt. Pratt stopped Haven, 61-46, in another opener. Chaparral dropped Clearwater, 49-30, and Kingman diced up Rose Hill, 54-27, in the other two first-round games.

"This game kind of typified our season. Nickerson is a very aggressive and physical team, and that type of game was allowed and our girls let that bother and intimidate them a little, I thought," said Wolgast. "The girls were more worried about getting fouled and less about the ball game. We just never were able to get into what we wanted to do."

The Wildcats made a game of it against the 16-3 Panthers for a quarter before the roof caved in in the second period. After eight minutes of play, Mulvane was behind only one, 10-9. "We did a good job of moving on defense and not letting them get off any good shots," said Wolgast. "And on offense, we were able to get the ball to Sheila (Mills) inside and she was able to get her shots off against their man-to-man defense, but after she scored six points in the first quarter, they started putting more pressure on the outside to make that entrance pass more difficult and started doubling up on Sheila. They just shut that off."

The team's top scorer scored only six points the rest of the game, finishing with 12 in her final game in a Wildcat uniform.

The Panthers started rolling in the second quarter, out-scoring Mulvane, 12-2, and by the end of three quarters, Nickerson had the game locked up with a 22-point lead.

"We cut it to seven points early in the third quarter but they picked up their intensity and got more aggressive and we didn't

handle it real well," added the MHS coach. "Going into the game, we knew they were going to press and play us man-to-man. I went to see them play last week and have talked to a few coaches. It also didn't help that Mulvane lost point guard Heather Taylor in the third quarter. She re-injured a knee she had hurt a day earlier in practice and sat out the rest of the game.

Another factor that hurt was another poor night from the field. Mulvane hit only 26% from the field (13-38) while the Panthers hit at a 46% clip (22-48). It was even more of a problem to hit from the line. The Mulvane girls made only one of eight free throw attempts. Nickerson made 12 out of 19.

The senior Mills, the team's top scorer all season, finished with 12 points. Sophomore Cody Watson had six points and Kristi McDowell finished with three.
