We didn't get that one but it comes at the first of the year. I'd be disappointed if it was one of our last games."

With junior Terrie Plotts hitting eight of the first 12 points for MHS, took the early lead, 12-8, in the first quarter, but the Indians took charge with a 14-point third quarter.

Junior guard Rhonda Davis topped the Cat scoring with 13 points and Plotts, a forward, scored 12. Guard Tiane Dossey scored nine points and sophomore Kathy Saxton finished with six points.

"I think offensively, we'll take care of ourselves," said Stinson. "We have some people out there who can score some points. Tiane and Rhonda didn't shoot the ball like they can. We haven't been working on our shooting in practice so I'm not worried about our offense. One thing we do need to do is get more of Lori Cox in the offense. She only took six shots the whole game. We need to have her shooting the ball, so we'll be looking inside to Lori more. It's important to get our two senior scorers in there (Dossey and Cox). They can
