# Cat Cagers Hang In Against Lions

Two letdowns is all the Lions needed. Mulvane High School's girls played Goddard tough Tuesday night, Dec. 10, in the opening round of the Circle Thunderbird Classic but the Lions made the most of two Mulvane letdowns for a 64-43 victory in the first round.

That pushed Coach Kelly Dennis' Wildcats into the loser's bracket, where they will tangle with Chanute at 6:15 p.m. Friday, Dec. 13, in the semifinal round of the eight-team tournament. The tourney is providing the first games of the year for Mulvane this year.

"I thought we played really hard and really well," emphasized Dennis. "We played about as hard as we could have played. By the fourth quarter, they kind of wore us down. They played 10 girls and had more depth than we did."

Coach Dennis pointed to two letdowns earlier in the game as the keys to the loss. "They came right out and hit three three-pointers in the first quarter, otherwise, we're right there with them," said Dennis. "Another big bucket was in the last minute or so of the first half. We were within four points but they got two steals and lay-ups, then they got an off-balance bucket at the buzzer which made it a 12-point difference. We should have been within a couple points then."

Dennis, starting her second season with the Wildcats, felt like her Cats had nothing to be ashamed of. "We really played the No. 5 ranked 5A team tough," said Dennis. "When we forced them into their half-court offense, we played them even but they won the battle out of the transition game. That's where they beat us."

Dennis also feels the Wildcats answered the question about whether or not they could handle the pressure defenses. Last year, that was a serious problem that never got solved. "We handled their pressure defense pretty well," said Dennis. "Our
