The Wildcats had five turnovers in the opening period and had difficulty getting to the boards, giving Andale extra shots. After one quarter, Mulvane trailed by a 17-9 count, but the Cats were still in the game at intermission thanks to their best offensive spurt. The Cat girls kept up with the Indians in the 2nd period but never could get an offense generated after halftime

Andale out-scored Mulvane, 36-14, in the final half to turn the game into a runaway

Freshman Tara Roberts led the MHS scor. ing with nine points. Guard Abby Sorensen finished with seven and both Shayna Duncan and Stephanie Tatum hit six points

For Mulvane senior guard Melissa Doerfer, it was a complete turnaround. After hitting a career high 26 in Mulvane's opener. she was held to only two points by Andale.
