Consolation Champs

Girls Regain Magic Touch

Better balance and some outside punch made Mulvane High School girls a potent opponent and helped the Wildcats to the consolation championship Saturday afternoon, Dec. 8, in the annual Circle Thunderbird Girls Classic.

Only a shocking first-round upset loss to Independence kept Coach Gregg Wolgast's veteran club on the sidelines later Saturday night as Augusta stopped Rose Hill, 56-50, for the tournament championship.

Independence took third place by blasting the host Thunderbirds, 56-38.

In semifinal action, Mulvane regained its touch Thursday, Dec. 6, by shelling Andover, 66-46, to move in against El Dorado for the consolation bracket title.

"I think we've regrouped," said Wolgast, whose highly-regarded team was popped, 60-50, by Independence in the first game of the season. Indy successfully jammed up the middle to stop Mulvane's Kendra Banzet, a tactic opponents will certainly consider this season. "Andover tried to do the same thing and they did keep Kendra from being involved in the game. But we had several other girls step forward and shoot the ball when they had the shots. They scored enough that it wasn't a problem, and this is what the girls are going to be faced with all year long. How well we do will depend upon how well we face up to that challenge."

El Dorado's Wildcats in the consolation title game went with a man-to-man in the second half and Mulvane buried them with Banzet busting loose with her finest game of the tournament, 28 points, as Mulvane out-gunned El Dorado, 30-10, in the final half to win going away.

"I was surprised El Dorado stayed with the man-to-man because Kendra just took over and dominated the game in the second half," said Wolgast. "It became just a matter of getting her the ball about every time and she scored. That's what she can do against a man defense."

El Dorado had played it tough in the opening two quarters and actually held a 30-24 lead at intermission. "We didn't play well in the first half and we got into foul trouble," said Wolgast. "We made a couple of changes and became more aggressive and worked harder on defense. That enabled us to shut them down in the second half."

Wolgast also singled out Kirsten Kuntz, who replaced a foul-ridden Banzet in the second quarter and played well to keep Mulvane in the ball game.

One of the good things coming out of this tournament is we know we have some balance now," said Wolgast. "Kendra led the scoring in the last game. Lisa Heersche was the top scorer against Andover and Ticia led against Independence. When Andover tried to jam it up, we got great balance, so everybody stepped up and took their shots to open things up. Once they opened it up, we were able to get the ball back into Kendra.

"Other teams are going to have to make a choice. They take Kendra out of the game and we have others coming up to score. If they don't, then Kendra will dominate."

The 6-foot, 3-inch Banzet pumped in 28 points against El Dorado, hitting 14 of 19 fielders. Another senior, Heersche, finished with her second double-figure game, hitting 14 points. Guard Kerri Taylor scored four.

The Cats also dominated the boards with 30 rebounds to only 15 for El Dorado.
