

Girls Go 2-0 In League

The Wildcats ran away and hid in the first half, leaving Valley Center in the dark Tuesday night, Dec. 18, in a 55-38 Chisholm Trail League triumph for Mulvane High School's girls in the final game before the Christmas break.

Coach Gregg Wolgast's Cats raced to a 20-13 lead after one quarter and by intermission, it was 35-19. "We played very well in the first half, especially on defense," said Wolgast. "That was the big key. They scored only 19 and 11 of those were free throws. We came out and took away what they were comfortable with, and the girls did a great job on the boards."

* With seniors Kendra Banzet (15 rebounds) and Ticia Nicholson (14) controlling the backboards, Mulvane enjoyed a 47-21 edge in rebounding.

Banzet finished the game with 23 points, including four buckets off the offensive boards. Guard Tricia Turner and Nicholson had eight points apiece and reserve Dawn Hicks and Lisa Heersche scored six each.

The Mulvane jayvees played much better but still tumbled, 52-39, despite a 23-point burst from center Sheila Mills. Robin Smith had six for the Cats and Kandie Strong had four.

Chisholm Trail League Division I championship in fine fashion Friday night, Dec. 13, at Goddard in what figured to be one of the biggest squabbles of the season.

Mulvane came out on top, breaking open a tight game in the third quarter with a 19-point surge on the way to a 51-43 victory.

MHS junior varsity couldn't match that feat as they lost, 30-12, to the Goddard jayvees.

"It was a nice one to get under our belts," said Wolgast. "I told the girls at the beginning of the year that we needed to win all our home games and win the big ones on the road to repeat and this certainly was a first step in the right direction."

Mulvane held only an 18-17 edge at intermission but got rolling in the third quarter when the Cats went up by 14.

Banzet and Heersche gave the visitors a fine outside-inside punch, Banzet scoring 17 points and Heersche having 16. Nicholson and Tricia Turner scored eight points each.

Top scorer for the Wildcat jayvees at Goddard were Sheila Mills with nine points and Anna Turner with a bucket.

The girls will be idle until January, when they go to it again at Augusta in another big CTL showdown Jan. 4th.
