The Lions forced Mulvane into 18 turnovers (Goddard had nine) and used a 10-1 Goddard blitz in the third quarter to rout Mulvane. The loss dropped Mulvane's record to 2-3.

The Wildcat junior varsity also found Goddard a poor host as the Lion jayvees came from behind for a 26-22 victory.

"We appeared to be in the ball game and making a comeback until they threw that 1-3-1 zone half-court press up in the third quarter and it just killed us," said Stinson. "We hustled and played good defense, we just have to work hard on beating the press."

Stinson singled out Lori Cox, who had 12 rebounds. Diane Mohney, who scored eight points to break out of her slump, and the rebounding of Daffa Reekie. Tawnya Infinger and Traci Lawless.

Mohney led the Cats' scorers and Infinger and Tracy Elliott and Cox were

next. Infinger with seven points and Elliott and Cox with four each.

The Mulvane junior varsity rallied from a scoreless first quarter and took the lead with a 12-point third period but Coach Tony Gourlay's gals couldn't hang on. Cox and Teresa Graybeal were the top two scorers. Graybeal with seven and Cox adding six.

The girls are idle until Friday, Jan. 6, when they travel to Buhler for a league game.
