I'd have to say that was one of our better games in by two years. We got there late, about 10 minutes before warm-up, so I'm kind of surprised we shot so well. And we had Michelle Fowler who didn't make the trip because she was sick. He also had a couple starters who were sick. We had a lot of reasons not to play well and lose the game, but the girls came out and played a great ball game."

Maybe from now on, Dennis will have her Cats just run off the bus and onto the floor because Mulvane came out hot, taking a 15-8 lead in the first quarter and having things well under control by the halftime with a 13-point advantage.

Three Cats were in double figures. Senior Crissy Carpenter had another outstanding game, scoring 20 points. Guard Lindsay Kendrick came through with 17 points and veteran senior center Dannelle Hughes had 13. Both Jennifer McCoskey and Shelley Richards chipped in four points.

"I think it was important to get off to a good start," said Dennis. "It was the last day of school before the Christmas break and it would have been easy to let it slip away, but the girls didn't. I think this was a huge game for us. It ranks right up there with beating Circle a week ago. We're going into a cou-

ple tough games right after Christmas against Rose Hill and Andover so we'll have some momentum going."

The Wildcat coach also was pleased with the way the girls responded on the backboards and against the pressure defense, which has been a real problem for Mulvane until now.

"We rebounded really well and took care of the ball," emphasized Dennis. "They ran a 1-3-1 halfcourt against us and after the first three possessions, I thought we passed the ball well and made good decisions with our passing. We were shaky the first three possessions but the girls started getting the ball on the baseline, where a 1-3-1 is the weakest, and Crissy made them pay. Kingman never did make the adjustment."

Dennis was especially happy to see how the Cats took care of business against the Eagle defense. "We knew they were going to run the 1-3-1 so so far, we haven't really shown that we could beat it. One thing I thought we needed to do was show teams that we could beat it and that means shooting well from outside. I think we did that Friday night. Now, I think other teams will have to sit up and take notice of our ability
